- The 24 Hour Universal Design Challenge was organized by TrinityHaus, the Centre for Excellence in Universal Design and the NDA.
- Main organisers; Dr A Fennell (TCD), J Hubbard, N Murphy (NDA/CEUD) and Professor Ruth Marrow (Queens University).
- There were five teams with a variety of design disciplines.
- Each team were given a map, ours was showing Abbey Street between Liffey street and Capel Street.
- We first walked, photographed, observed and got inspiration on how un accessible to everyone it is.







THE PROJECT BRIEF

- Each team was assigned a different route through the city
- Teams had a design sponsor each a member of the public with a disability, to identify obstacles and problems
- Teams had their own conference room for the 24 hours to come up with an idea, design it and present to a team of judges and the public
- Teams worked throughout the night to come up with a solution based on their experiences to fulfill the principles of universal design








- Also just for fun for users to log distances and routes they walked













































































































































































